

Atlas: Practicalities of Managing Sudden Childhood Bereavement

27th March 2019

This study day is for staff who want to be prepared for times of pupil sudden bereavement. Through taught material, tried and tested resources, and practical exercises, delegates will have the chance to gain a sense of the steps involved in responding to the impact of a sudden death of one or more pupils. The role of school structures, home-school relationships and pupil age will also be considered.

This study day is aimed at those who work directly with children, whether that be a class teacher, a member of the pastoral team, or a school bereavement lead practitioner. The content is also suitable for non-school staff whose work involves an interface with families and children.

Ideally you will have completed our "Introduction to Childhood Bereavement for Professionals" study day, as this provides a foundation in how loss impacts on childhood development, which is a key factor in effective childhood bereavement management.

Ideally delegates' schools also will have, or be in the process of creating, a bereavement policy*
